PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: Parent Mentor Program

The Parent Mentor Program, or "PMP," is a nonprofit program in which parent mentors, mainly Latina and Black mothers, become leaders in the community by volunteering daily in local classrooms. Parent mentors provide an extra set of eyes, ears, and hands in the classroom, while encouraging parent involvement in school and fostering a connection with the community.

The Friendship House has 35 parent mentors in its program, all of whom work in classrooms across Peoria and are supported with weekly trainings on leadership and instructional techniques for

the classroom. Mentors are taught skills that will further their future employment opportunities, while also supporting teachers and increasing student learning.

This month, our PMP staff coordinators attended a conference in Chicago where they received training in leadership and unity from the PMP organizers of Illinois. The staff will attend a larger PMP conference in April, where they will get the chance to meet fellow PMP coordinators across the state and continue to strengthen their leadership knowledge to assist our parent mentors.



S.T.E.A.M.S. Corner

Pathway to YOUR Future is a S.T.E.A.M.S. Academy program designed to prepare and support high school students in their transition to adulthood. Our "Pathways," as we call them, work at the Peoria Friendship House helping with our after-school and food pantry programs. This provides the Pathways with the invaluable experience of holding down a real job. It teaches them responsibility in the workplace, how to communicate with work management, the importance of time management, and how to work effectively with coworkers.

In addition to this real-world job experience, the Pathway Program aims to give students experience and certification in various fields in order to increase their post-grad job opportunities immediately out of high school. This includes CPR, Food Handling, CDL, resume building and interview skills, and more.



This month, our Pathway students got the opportunity to learn about an important aspect of adulthood that isn't typically taught in school: money. Pathways attended a field trip to Busey Bank, where they learned about personal finance, student loans, budgeting, and emergency savings.

The students even participated in a budgeting exercise where they were given mock life scenarios and had to calculate their expenses in vs. expenses out and see how much money they had left over for spending. This helped students recognize the responsibility that comes with adulthood, like having to pay for insurance, loans, and various bills before you can purchase things for "fun." It also encouraged them to reflect on their priorities when it comes to spending and saving money. We plan to have more valuable field trips for our Pathways in the near future!
