For many of our kids, this was their very first time casting a fishing pole or swimming in a natural lake, and their excitement and energy was through the roof! The Camp Dallas staff and volunteers served as mentors throughout the day, guiding our students through trying new



things and helping them feel welcome in a new environment.
